

Calling the Carrollton Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) Net. This is [CALL SIGN, ARES #]. My name is [FIRST NAME], and I will be the net control operator. This net is being called for the purposes of a Storm Spotting net.

Any emergency or priority traffic will be handled with top priority during the net. If you have emergency or priority traffic, please come now.

[PAUSE FOR TRAFFIC]

If you need to pass emergency or priority traffic during this net, please notify net control by using the words, “BREAK, BREAK” and your traffic will be handled accordingly.

We will now take check-ins in order of ARES affiliation. All stations will have an opportunity to check in, however please wait for the appropriate check-in group. To check in, give your call sign phonetically, ARES number and your first name.

We will begin by taking check-ins from Carrollton ARES officers. Please come now

We will now take check-ins from Carrollton ARES members. Please come now.

[CARROLLTON ARES MEMBERS CHECK IN]

Stop after 8-10 check-ins and verify correctness of each station & ID number.

If conditions permit, list minimum reporting criteria from the CCRM:

Minimum Reporting Criteria

- 1. One (1) inch per hour rain.**
- 2. Wind greater than fifty (50) miles per hour.**
- 3. Hail larger than one-quarter (1/4) inch.**
